



Your Guide to the Top 20 Things to do in Swaledale

Swaledale offers a huge range of visitor activities and attractions, both outdoor and indoor, and whatever the weather! Use this guide to help you plan your trip and get the most out of this beautiful and fascinating area...

1. Go for a drive - get a great overview of Swaledale and neighbouring Arkengarthdale by driving the **Dales Trail**, a fabulous scenic tour of this stunning region which introduces you to incredible views and scenery, pretty local villages including Muker, Low Row, Keld and Reeth, the beautiful River Swale, the highest pub in the UK - the Tan Hill Inn, traditional stone barns and walls, heather moors and a wealth of wildlife.

The Trail even enables you to retrace the steps of famous TV vet James Herriot as you cross the famous water splash at Langthwaite which featured in the title sequence of **All Creatures Great and Small!**

2. Go for a walk - Swaledale offers fantastic walking for all abilities and the scenery is both beautiful and dramatic. Swaledale is renowned for its famous wildflower meadows, dry stone walls and barns and wonderful walking along the River Swale.

The Kisdon Hill, Muker, Keld circular is a stunningly beautiful walk and features in The Ramblers' Top 50 Walks in the UK. Enjoy beautiful views and learn the history of the Corpse Way.
